News on Jim Bell's Principal Position

This position will be a 54-week fixed-term contract. Due to the length of the contract Jim will need to relinquish his position as principal of Lakelands Primary School. I have been rolled over for Term 3 whilst the department runs a selection process to fill the principal position. Once the application process is completed I will inform parents and the community of the outcome.

Social Safety Focus Day - Wednesday, 29 August 2018

Last year the school in conjunction with the School Board committed to holding an annual awareness day focusing on issues within our community such as cyber interaction, social and emotional wellbeing and mental health. You may recall we had a "You Think You Know" <https://www.thinkuknow.org.au/parents-portal> visit for students and parents highlighting the challenges associated with our online footprint. I have included the link as it has great resources for parents that are designed around knowing how to be involved with your child's internet activities.

This year we have committed to focus on youth mental health and what our role in "bullying" may be and target the Year 3 – 6 cohort. The school is very excited about

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engaging with a motivational speaker - Luke S. Kennedy - who has recently toured the country talking about his own personal story of leading a life of crime, suffering from anxiety and depression and how he turned his life around to inspire others. Luke has returned to WA after making a huge impact at Wembley Primary School and they have requested his return.

The focus of his talk is the topics of resilience, how to be yourself, mental health/wellness, and issues around bullying, including self-bullying (negative self-talk). His story is deep, inspiring and real. He has received fantastic feedback with his approach and tailors his talks to the intended audience (which he will do for our Year 3-6 students).

Talented and Gifted Program

Michelle Neve is using her considerable experience as a PEAC teacher to run a Gifted and Talented program at Lakelands PS this term. For our pilot program in 2018, the TAGS program will run on a Wednesday. Identified students from Years 1-6 will be offered a 1 hour (minimum) program focusing on critical and creative thinking. Students will initially focus on the creative thinking skills of: flexibility, fluency, originality, elaboration, curiosity and complexity before moving onto some creative problem solving. Notes were sent home for those students selected to take part in the first round of groupings.

You may be aware that officially 31 July 2018 was the cut-off date for Department of Education Kindy enrolments. Please submit your application into our office ASAP to be included for the 2019 year. We are now finalising enrolments and will be interviewing and offering places for 2019 shortly. You don't want to miss out! School Values

After receiving feedback from students last term that it took too long for them to receive their bands, staff and students had the opportunity to put forward ideas. These were the options:

- Option 1: Values Bands continue to be handed out at a whole school assembly (Senior)
- Option 2: Values Bands to be handed out at a Values Assembly so students get them straight away. They will then be announced at the next assembly so the whole school can celebrate their fantastic achievement.

Due to the high numbers of votes by students for Option 2, Values Bands will now be presented at the Friday Values assembly and then students will be acknowledged at the next school assembly. Parents will be notified by letter and will have the option to attend the Friday Values assembly, school assembly or both.

Dogs on school grounds

On occasion we notice parents bringing dogs to school when dropping off or picking up their children. **The Department's position is that dogs should not be on school grounds unless it is a guide dog or 'Story dog'**. As such can I ask parents not to bring dogs to school. Friendly dogs are still a risk with family pets accounting for 40% of all attacks and the last thing we want is for a dog to become alarmed and bite a child. Thank you for your support.

Stranger Danger Awareness

Safety is a priority at Lakelands Primary School and we strongly encourage students and families to be aware of potential dangers in the community when travelling to and from school. Here are some suggestions to help your children stay safe:

- always travel in a group
- walk on the right hand side of the road to face oncoming traffic
- wherever possible, leave space between you and the roadway
- stay in view – avoid going into areas that are hidden (such as parkland bush or behind shopping centres)
- be alert – earphones and headphones can reduce your awareness considerably
- if a passing car stops nearby, never get too close
- run from a situation if you feel at risk
- give this advice to your brothers and sisters, especially if they are younger
- report suspicious behaviour to your parents, school and the police
- if you can get it safely, try to photograph or remember the number plate of the car
- report numbers plates of cars and the clothing or distinguishing features of individuals to police.






